

Changed Life Story: Micah Garrison

I've been coming to Crossroads for 2 years. Before that my life was a complete disaster!

In 2018, I found myself in jail because of a heroin addiction. While I was in jail, I remember being in so much emotional and physical pain that I prayed to God, "If you are real and you can hear me, I need your help!"

There were some pastors who came into the jail and taught Celebrate Recovery every week and one of the lessons they taught was called Crossroads! It's so crazy to look back at that moment because it was like God was paving this path for me right from the beginning.

This lesson was about how you are going down this path in life and you have a chance to make a turn or you can keep going and end up right back where you are right now. God was calling me to make a change. I gave my life to Jesus, but I didn't know what to do after that.

Near the end of the rehab program I was in, they wanted you to find a home church. I was nervous just coming in for the first time as a recovering addict, and the first thing I remembered was that lesson called Crossroads and I knew this was where I was supposed to be!

Within two weeks, they encouraged me to volunteer and before I knew it I was on the leadership team at Celebrate Recovery. The pastors really took the time to pour into me and I realized that I had never had someone care that much about me and invest in me as a person.

Earlier this year, we went through the "Circle Maker" series, and I remember that at the prayer and worship night I felt like God was calling me into ministry. A month later, Pastor Ashley called me and asked me if I would like to join the staff at Crossroads. That was such a life-changing moment for me, because not a lot of people can look at someone recovering from addiction and think that they have value.

Now I am on staff full-time at Crossroads helping out with Celebrate Recovery and the New Start Ministry. I get to connect people with Jesus and show them how much they are loved. That's what changed my life! The amazing thing about Crossroads is that they are not saying "You Are Loved" because it looks good on a t-shirt. They love people because Jesus loves people.



Our generosity will enable us to:

- 1. Celebrate Changed Lives with 1,000 Baptisms by 2025.
- 2. Increase the impact of our Online Campus by investing in the development of Small Group resources and a Leadership Podcast that will expand our reach and enable us to invite 10,000 people each week to a changed life.
- 3. Increase the impact of Crossroads TV by investing in technology upgrades and additional airtime on multiple networks that will enable us to invite 6,500 people each week to a changed life.
- **4.** Invest in a residency program that will raise up the next generation of leaders at Crossroads, who will launch future campuses and further develop recovery ministries.
- **5.** Invest in final renovations to our current facilities, creating an inviting environment where everyone can connect with God.





PHASE 2:

RECEIVE \$4 MILLION FOR A NEW WORSHIP AND COMMUNITY CENTER. (Fall 2023)

Our generosity will enable us to:

- 1. Invest in a new worship and community center that will enable us to connect 3,500 people each weekend in live worship services and serve as a hub of activity for our community throughout the week.
- **2.** Invest in the reconfiguration of our existing facilities to enhance the impact of Crossroads KIDS, Crossroads Student Ministry and Crossroads Preschool.



Generosity Story: Scott Pealer

We have been part of the Crossroads family for 20 years! When we first arrived the people were very welcoming – it felt like home right away. The first Sunday we attended I looked at Patsy and said, "I think we found our church!".

Right after we started attending Crossroads, I had a defining moment with God that completely changed my life.

I was at home getting ready to pay my bills and the first thing I did was write out a check for our tithe. I set it up on the table and then I went ahead and paid all of the other bills that I had to pay. When I got done, I looked at my checkbook and I realized that we had \$33 dollars left to live on for the next month.

I looked at the checkbook and I looked at my tithe, and at that moment I heard this booming voice say, "Don't worry Scott. I will take care of you." I picked up the tithe check, put it in an envelope and brought it to the church the next day. Two weeks later we received several hundred dollars in the mail that I did not expect to get!

Because of that experience, I have learned that God is faithful. He is always with you and you can trust Him.

What excites me about Crossroads is that we are trying to reach people. We aren't really about brick and mortar. We are trying to expand the church and the church is people! I get excited about all of the kids I see at church – they love it here and they bring their parents! As our church continues to grow, I'm thrilled to be part of the Crossroads family and excited to see where God is going to take us.

INITIAL GIVER

I make adjustments and decide to give a specific faith percentage of my income to my local church (for some this is the faith step of giving 10%).

RADICAL GIVER

I dream about my opportunity to leave a legacy of generosity.

I want to give all that I can to see changed lives and to build eternal relationships.

I regularly give offerings in addition to 10% of my income.

I ask myself, "What do I need to live on?"
